CLI Community Employment Support Services passed its first CARF (Commission for Accrediting Rehabilitation Facilities) survey this week with a score of just of 95%. Getting ready for this survey was a team effort with lots of hard work done by a group of people—but I want to particularly recognize Glenda Foster's work over the years in making the program what it is—and Jen Swicker's tenacity in pulling all of the paper compliance together. The surveyors were really complimentary about CLI, our staff, our obvious person-centeredness, and all of our community-relationship building. I think that everyone needs to pat themselves on the back!

I want to talk a little more about the Transformation grant that CLI has been awarded by DODD. The purpose of the grant is to allow progressive agencies to tell DODD where we are today—an agency self-assessment—and then tell DODD our plan for how CLI integrates people into the community. Most of you probably know that this has been something that we've been working on for years—but we will need to make some pretty bold moves soon. Additional smaller "hubs" so that people who aren't interested in working in the workshop, don't have to hang out at the workshop—and we can build new community resources that will provide us with more integration opportunities.

With that in mind, we'll be hosting a focus group forum on the first Imagine Norwalk event on Friday, June 9th, between 4pm – 7pm. It will be held in CLI's new space at 16 West Main Street and will be a good chance to answer questions and collect more ideas.

CLI Document Destruction Is Looking for a Full-Time Pick-up Driver

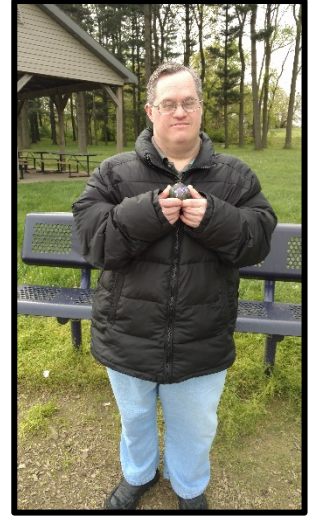
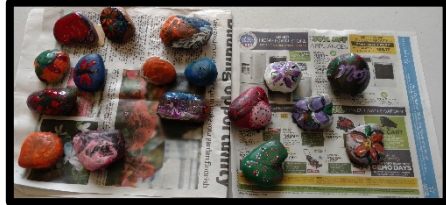
The shredding program has really grown and Kristi, Mags & Mandy need help.
